

Targeted Federal Homelessness Funding: How the President's 2025 Budget Compares



The President's 2025 Budget targets **more than \$10 billion** in federal funding for homelessness assistance programs. The Budget represents an **overall 11% increase** from 2023 enacted funding and a **40% increase** for Health Care for the Homeless, 16% increase for HUD-VA Supportive Housing, 12% increase for Homeless Assistance Grants, and 10% increase for Transitional Housing Assistance Grants to Victims of Sexual Assault.
